Hartwood Council Meeting - June 24, 2012

Called to order 4:05 p.m.

Jean/Elizabeth reads last council's minutes.-- there was a typo regarding archery practices -- 'Saturday' should read 'Sunday'Allison moves to accept minutes; John seconds.

John reads officer's reports:

* MoS report from Lee/Thorfinn-- Practice and Attendance: 6:30pm Monday at 421 Calverley \pl. Average attendance has been holding at around 14 fighters. We have been getting a few fighters down from Seagirt every second week. They have been helping us with our fighting and getting some of us carded. There have been 4 fighters carded this month.

Equipment: The iron key up to date has swollen due to the generosity of folks playing hear and some of the Seagirtians detonation of 3 new helmets and another donated from Fjordland. I will list the full iron key at length in my next report or at the earliest date possible there is a great deal of it and a need a day off to do it and a couple of volunteers. But estimated we probably have 4 full sets and many various bits and pieces.— John adds they are beginning Rapier as well, thanks to our Seagirtian friends coming up to teach.

* Chatelaine report from Valerie/Elspeth - I'm fairly new as well but when I asked around re. Gold Key, what I learned is that there is virtually nothing.

I was told there was an attempt some years ago to standardize the old ratty Gold Key, so the old stuff was purged in preparation for step two - the making of the new stuff. However step two did not happen. Hence: no Gold Key.

I have a few hand-me-down costumes which were recently donated and some other gear that I'm holding ... pending some decision on what we should do with it.

A few months back, after determining there was no Gold Key, I was able to score a large bag of fabric (drapes etc.) and a box of new sheets from Freecycle, which would provide all the fabric we could want to rebuild Gold Key. I also have the framework for a changing booth for camping events and a little portable stand - scored at ReStore for \$2 :-) - to hold the costumes. I've also acquired a large suitcase and a trunk to transport them to events.

The last Chatelaine thing I did was send around an invitation to all the people on my newbie/potential member list inviting them to the TUTR in Port Alberni. I also edited and sent around the photos taken at the demo in Feburary (we set up a photo booth and invited those attending to put on costumes and get their photos taken). With the photos, I included an invitation to register for the TUTR.

Prior to that I created some mini-business card brochures for distribution and had 1,000 of them printed. They have been distributed to each area but probably need replenishing. We've also just begun talking about revising the website to make it more mundane friendly, with a section for new people.

I imagine the shire does need functioning Gold Key ASAP so I'll see if I can break free some time by the end of this month to build at least some costumes. I am totally committed to Regionals this weekend

and will be "volunteering" to work next weekend to get ready for a company conference, but hopefully I will be able to work on Gold Key the following weekend.

(Editor's Note: The following was given to me in March 2012 and was to have gone in the April newsletter.)

To the good gentles of Hartwood, greetings.

It is hard to imagine that a short five months ago my family was busy unpacking our belongings and trying best not to get lost while finding new doctors, new grocery stores, new schools, and new friends, but in very quick order we managed. The mundane items were tackled by priority and the friends and the SCA were right there where we needed them, not that the residents of Hartwood were any strangers to us

For many years we have interacted with the people of Hartwood: Zoran, Halima and Charles, Anicia and Aleyn were regular friends while we were in False Isle; all the good people we met when we attended Raven's War a few years back; and then of course all the folk who have been traveling to the Principality events, Marina, Kjartan, Cecille, as well as the names mentioned above.

Adventures in Building a Norse Tent

Part I - the Frame

This is not a how-to article, but a short chronicle of my adventure, which I hope will encourage you to create a medieval tent or pavilion of your own.

I have long wanted to make a period pavilion, specifically a free-standing one. I made a miniature Norse tent for my toddler son, many years ago, based on the instructions in the Known World Handbook. In more recent years, HL Aleyn, HL Anicia, and Lady Margarita built a lovely spoked bell pavilion, and I was further encouraged. They graciously shared with all of us

the knowledge and experience gained from their own adventure, and Aleyn even offered his woodworking skills to help make the hub, if I chose to go that route. When my modern tent met it's end, I decided that this was it. I would finally replace it with a period tent. I next had to put thought into what I needed and wanted, and make a firm decision about what kind of tent I would make for myself.

When choosing the style of your pavilion or tent, there are many factors to consider:

- Budget
- Skills & tools available
- How will you transport your tent?
- Size needs
- Persona (it may not always be desired or practical to necessarily stay within your persona)
- Are guy-lines problematic for you?
- Ease of set up. Do you need to be able to set it up yourself?

For me, a Norse tent fit all of my needs and preferences, except that I had a Gaelic persona. However, that was slowly changing, and I soon became a Hiberno Norse woman, happily joining my Gaelic side with a new Norse side.

That decision made, it was time to get down to business. I started in the obvious place, the internet. There are a more than a few good articles out there, on various types of portable medieval shelters. Images too, are a good inspiration. I read a few articles, chose the two that I was most comfortable with, and read them several times, making notes and sketches. I changed some things, to suit my desired dimensions, skills (or lack thereof) and available tools.

Once I had formulated a plan, I laid out the steps on numbered index cards, to help me stay on track. I also spoke with people who had built and/or purchased Norse tents, to be sure that the 2' X 3' I was using as a ridgepole and side poles was adequate for a 12' long tent. Much to my relief, those who had used it before me were quite pleased with how well it has performed for them over the years.

I challenged myself to buy as many of the supplies for my project as possible at my workplace, The Home Depot. In the end, I only bought the thread and ties elsewhere. Large pieces of canvas drop-cloth from the paint department would become my tent fabric.

What follows is a series of photos and descriptions, of the steps I took to make my frame. If you find yourself thinking, "I could have done this better," or "I would have done that differently," then perhaps you should! I would dearly love to see the Hartwood encampments abounding with period pavilions.

The pieces of 2" X 3" that will become my ridgepole and side poles, marked out for a rough cut. The idea of a Norse tent is that the front and back of the frame are made from an equilateral triangle, which is held together by the ridgepole and side poles. The holes at the ends of the uprights and ground brace act as tenons, while the ends of the poles act as mortises. You can see a close-up of how this works in the last photo. These will be the mortised ends.



Tony did the rough cuts of the tenons for me.




The mortise and tenon fittings will stay snug with the help of pegs. I drilled the holes for the pegs before rounding out the tenons, so that the drill bit wouldn't slip on the curved surface.



Here, I am roughing out the corners with a jigsaw, before getting to work with my sander and some course sandpaper, to round out the tenon.



Roughed out and waiting to be refined with a sander.



At this point, the tenons are sanded fairly round, and fit nicely into the mortises. I am pleased!



A before-and-after of a pair of tenons.




In order to fit the 12' 10" poles into my car, they had to be made in two pieces each. So, I needed a sturdy method of joining the two pieces together in order to raise the tent, once onsite. I have cut a 6' length of angle iron into six pieces, to create partial sleeves. A sleeve would have been good, but was beyond my area of skill.



The use of carriage bolts with two pieces of angle iron for each join made a sturdy frame. But, for my next frame, I will use four longer pieces of flat iron on each join, and more carriage bolts. With the angle iron on 2" X 3", the holes could not be centered, and therefore not perfectly matched up with the opposite side.



With our very old drill, the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " holes at the end of each upright and ground brace were a bit tough to drill, so Tony did that part for me.



The frame is almost complete at this point. I have put the end pieces together, holding them in place with pieces of cedar branches, so that I can mark out where the cuts need to be

made, for the final step.



It's as simple as this. I just mark where the cuts need to be, along the ground braces, above and below. I will leave the tops of the uprights uncut for now. Eventually, they will have carved critter heads on them. Cutting where I have marked, at the ends of the uprights and ground brace will be my final step.



The finished frame. I'm happy with the size, and with how easily I was able to put it up and take it down by myself. Of course, once the fabric is added, it won't be as easy, but I do believe it will still be doable.



Supervisor inspection. Approved!



I have enjoyed this journey, and look forward to using my new tent. His Lordship Kjartan has made me my first accessory – a Norse camp stool – and I am working on a cooler made from a six-board chest. My Norse encampment just gets Norser....

My adventure will continue in a future issue, with Part II – the Tent.
