Scribal Stuffs - Maminka

Anyone who has worked with Elvina and me on charter designs for the Principality has heard us constantly talking about the ductus or exemplar.

What is this thing, and why is it so important to submit with your calligraphy on a charter design? Well, we would like to simplify this for you, as well as bring to your attention the importance of it.


The ductus is simply the full upper and lower case of the alphabet, in the same hand you used for the charter calligraphy. But that isn't all. It is also the numbers from 0-1, and Roman numerals.


You might want to know why this is so important. It's to enable the stunt-scribe, the person who will be adding information to the charter at or before an event, to add names and/or dates, in as similar a hand as you used, to make the charter calligraphy look neat and flow nicely.

When the charter is submitted to the Reign, we add that ductus to the bottom 3" of the charter to allow some practice room for the stunt-scribe to try and copy your calligraphy hand. When they are comfortable, they can then add the recipient's name, and the award date, without it looking rushed or improvised. We need and appreciate stunt-scribes; their job is important to the award process, so we like to make their job as seamless as possible.

So for all calligraphers out there, please remember this small but impactful piece of information that

should always accompany your calligraphy when submitting text and charter designs. Teamwork makes the dream work!





This Humanistic hand is deceptively simple, but if you note in the provided ductus/exemplar, there are two forms of the letter 'S' (both are used in the charter as well as the ligatures).



In this example, an excerpt pulled from a charter, you can see the blank areas where the recipient's name and the award date will need to be inserted, as well as the Anno Societis

And one last example, showing quite obviously why a ductus/exemplar would be needed for this charter. These capitals take some figuring out!

But as you can see, no numbers were provided in this ductus, so it will take either the digital deputy or the stunt scribe some time to figure out numbers that will fit with this beautiful hand without ruining the flowing look of the calligraphy.



Eventing with Adelheid - Hartwood TUTR February 2-4, 2024

Arts and Science and Bardic enthusiasts recently descended on Hartwood for the latest TUTR (The University of Tir Righ) session, and it was a stellar success! The team of Alicia, Beatris and Giovanna lined up a series of classes that left attendees with a wealth of both knowledge and inspiration, and provided an opportunity for SCAdians to bond over a wide variety of interests. In addition to the classes, the opportunity for some social connection with SCA folks was especially appreciated by this winter recluse.



We arrived Friday night to a welcoming gate crew who helped us get set up for a night of hall camping. People drifted in from all over Tir Righ - I met people from Hartwood, Seagirt, Lions Gate, Lionsdale, and even from Appledore. Lights dimmed, and quiet conversations slowly dwindled away as we slumbered. It was an early start, but coffee and breakfast were waiting for us downstairs where we gathered for a pre-class chat. I met some interesting people with fascinating histories and although I could have chatted for hours, it was soon time for classes to begin.

It had been difficult to select classes, as there were so many interesting topics to choose from, but the online preregistration process was very easy. There were four classrooms running blocks of 1 to 2 hours, depending on the material, and these went full day Saturday and up to lunch on Sunday. There was also a potluck dinner Saturday night for volunteers and students.

I took mostly fibre art classes, and unfortunately could only stay for one day. One of my companions took advantage of the many scribal options, and the other was actually teaching an interactive and lively Introduction to Bardic Arts. Yes, there were puppets!

Approximately 50 people were in attendance. Fibre arts classes ranged from fingerweaving to sprang, drawn embroidery, button making, to how to pattern a Thobe, the Bayeux tapestry stitch, and a flat cap. Scribal was well represented with Uncial calligraphy, spacing for calligraphy, charter painting and design. There were fascinating topics such as Medieval Calculus, making ice in the desert, reading and writing runes, and a thorough class on documentation. There were classes on creating a device concealment book, carving a spoon, making a Flemish Twist bowstring, "Vice with Cards and Dice", how to survive and thrive at events, a chivalry and etiquette class, and some wonderful bardic and performing arts. There was even a 16th century Italian Dance class for those Terpsichores among us.

The University of Tir Righ has been a part of our Principality since November of 2007, founded to provide classes in a wide range of topics in an inclusive environment and safe place to learn. We are very fortunate to have TUTR sessions as these events are essential for fostering a knowledgeable and well-rounded Principality. They promote interdisciplinary thinking and allow attendees to explore the connections between seemingly disparate subjects.

If this weekend is any indication, I am not alone in my support for class based events, especially in the long winter months. I know I came away with a burst of post-event inspiration, some new friends and connections, and more

rabbit holes to explore. Huzzah to the teachers and students, and another heartfelt thank-you to the planners and volunteers of Hartwood for organizing such a great event. We are all looking forward to the next one!

What is your SCA name?

How long have you been a scribe?

About eight years for calligraphy, and six years for wordsmithing. I've always had a love for writing, so it was natural to jump in when the Thornwold Scriptorium was founded!

What do you enjoy most about being a scribe?

Getting to see people's faces light up when they see or hear my work - it makes any project worth its weight in gold.




Have you ever held an office/position as a Scribe?

If so, please describe what office, briefly what it entailed, and anything you would like to share with the populace about the position and your experience in it.

I have! I was Principality Scribe for Mary Grace and Havordh Ættarbani. It was a wonderful and educational experience, I got to see just how much work goes into getting all the parts of the charters and scrolls put together in a timely manner. I also definitely learned the importance of delegating and having an awesome team!

What is your scribal pet peeve?

When your nib comes out cleanly on the practice sheet, then blots on the original - a period look but a frustrating one!



Was there anyone that helped you along your scribal journey that you would like to acknowledge? If so, how did they influence you on this journey?

I wouldn't be here today without the Thornwold Scriptorium and the support of my Household and friends, especially Genevieve for her support and Jadwiga for their guidance. Thank you all for believing in me!

Do you have any special tips, tricks, or techniques that you use or have learned through your scribal journey?

Always try. Being paralyzed by trying to make it perfect means no results. Medieval scribes weren't perfect and neither are we, but we can only get better by doing more!

Have you ever done an original award? If so, what did you learn though the process? Do you have any advice you would pass on to someone new to original work? I have - one of my first calligraphy projects was an original in fact! I learned early on with calligraphy to do a practice run on scrap paper first, so you can make sure the words fit. Lightboxes are wonderful to use too! Again, don't be scared, they will love your work if you put love into it!

What is your favorite Principality Award that you have painted or designed? Why is that your favorite?

I think it's the words for the Viscounty scrolls I did for Mary Grace and Havordh - I was very proud of how they turned out, and there was a tiny reference to Shrek for Havordh with his permission. :)

What is the best or most impactful piece of advice you have ever received through your scribal journey?

Done is better than perfect - we always give our utter best, but don't get so hung up on details that you never finish.

Is there anything that you would say to your younger scribal self just starting out on this path?

Don't burn yourself out - you're doing this for fun and to better your art, never forget that!

Is there anything else that you would like to say or add as our Spotlight Scribe?

Never stop learning and always have fun!! Thank you so much for including this humble wordsmith!
